A healthy mixture of theme based activities and outdoor fun is part of every day. Our teachers have extensive early childhood experience. Preschool teacher-student ratio is 1:10.

PRESCHOOL CAMP AGES 3-4

Pembroke's 8-week Preschool Summer Camp program runs from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm. Drop-off begins at 8:50 am. Parents must provide a morning snack and beverage each day. Dismissal is at 12:00 noon.

Children must register for a minimum of **3 camp days** per week. The days you pick are flexible. You can pick any 3 or more days you want and any week(s) you want. We will make every effort to accommodate your requests, but space is filled on a first-come-first-served basis.

KINDERGARTEN PREP CAMP

Getting ready for kindergarten? This camp program is specially designed for children entering kindergarten in the fall. Now, there is no need to worry. Your new kindergartner will have a great time this summer and be ready for success on the first day of grade school.

Based on Pembroke Kids' kindergarten curriculum, **Kindergarten Prep Camp** is a half-day program that will feature fun-filled activities and academics in a creative, hands-on learning environment. In addition to lots of summer fun, campers will experience daily math workshops, science explorations, handwriting practice, and creative writing activities designed to reinforce the important skills new kindergartners need most.

Our summer writer's workshop will guide campers in the use of "sound spelling" as they craft stories based on ideas from their own experiences. Our play-based approach to learning will help campers strengthen their number sense and letter-sound correspondence.

We'll share weekly themes with our preschool friends but extend the themes with a focus on writing and math skills. Campers will also become published authors as they create numerous stories exploring different genres during our 8-week summer program. Monday through Friday camp attendance is strongly encouraged.

SCHOOL AGE CAMP GRADES 1-6

Explore new ideas, develop new skills, and make new friends in a safe, supportive and fun-filled environment. The **Digital Discovery Center** summer camp program for school-age children offers an equal balance of fun and learning that will provide your child with one of the most enjoyable summer experiences possible.

Camp runs from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. Parents should provide a morning and afternoon snack and a lunch (including beverage). We require the use of an insulated cooler with the camper's name on it.

Campers are strongly encouraged to sign up for a week at a time but must register for a minimum of **3 camp days** per week. The days you pick are flexible. You can pick any 3 or more days you want and any week(s) you want. We will make every effort to accommodate your requests, but space is filled on a first-come-first-served basis. We also reserve the right to cancel any week that has insufficient enrollment.

Week 1: June 10-14

Construction Zone - Join us for a fun-filled week of LEGOs, blocks, marble racers, jacks and straws, trains and tracks, pipes, sculptures and more! This week gives campers the opportunity to use their creativity while working with a variety of materials. If you can imagine it, we can build it! Get started on your construction plans now!

Week 2: June 17-21

Paint Your Masterpiece - Campers will experiment with different forms of art materials. Everyday will be a new adventure as we make wonderful creations with water-colors, finger paints, tempera cakes, oil pastels, puffy paints, glitter gel, and more. Campers will be encouraged to explore their imagination and discover their creativity!

Week 3: June 24-28

Digging For Dinosaurs - Calling all Junior Paleontologists! Come discover the prehistoric world of dinosaurs! Learn about the different types of dinosaurs, where they lived, and what they ate. We will read stories about dinosaurs, measure how long they were, and excavate dinosaur bones! Campers will get a special visit from the Lorain County Metroparks' CONSTRUCT-A-SAURUS.

**Week 4: July 1-3**

Waterworks - Summer is a great time to go crazy with water outside. Our campers will help create a water wall with recycled materials. The "kid car wash" is ready and waiting for tricycles and kids alike to get squeaky clean. The sprinkler is on and waiting for your little camper. Please bring a change of clothes and a towel every day!

Week 5: July 8-12

Camping - Let's pack our bags and pitch a tent! It's time to go camping! We will explore the great outdoors as we go for a hike, sing campfire songs, tell not-so-scary stories and eat our snack around a "campfire". Of course, no camping trip is complete without Smore's and trail mix! The campers will enjoy a special visit from Jungle Terry!

Week 6: July 15-19

Fairy Tale Fun - Campers will sing songs, use props, masks and felt pieces as they become better acquainted with their favorite Fairy Tale and Nursery Rhyme characters. We will use our imaginations as we act out our favorite Nursery Rhymes and Fairy Tales for our audience. We would like to invite you to be our guest!

Week 7: July 22-26

Movin' & Groovin' - This week is all about sounds, singing, and finding different ways to move. We will enjoy marching, dancing, twirling and even moving like our favorite animals! Campers will also listen to different kinds of music and decide which is their favorite. Special guest visit from Mr. Steve and his guitar!

Week 8: July 29-August 2

Potions and Concoctions - Campers will explore and discover and mix all kinds of liquids and solids. We will mix oil and colored water, baking soda and vinegar, pudding mix and milk, glitter and gel, shaving cream and glue, dirt and water, and more! Please wear old clothes and get ready to have some fun!

Kindergarten Prep Skills Focus

In the kindergarten prep classroom, themes will be the same as preschool classes. Campers will experience a real kindergarten class setting every day and focus on skills such as name writing and activities such as journaling and math.



Grades 1–2 Weekly Camp Themes

Week 1: June 10-14

- A) **Creepy Crawlies** - Children are fascinated with small creatures. This week will be full of literature's most beloved creatures, from hungry caterpillars to beautiful butterflies. We will mix wonder and whimsy to help campers understand and appreciate the smallest of creatures.
- B) **Cooking Around the World** - \$10 materials fee. Campers will learn about foods and the countries they come from. We will make tacos, pizza, rice and more! Campers will learn skills such as measuring, chopping, slicing, and eating with chopsticks!

Week 2: June 17-21

- A) **Rocket Math** - Come explore the universe with Math Man while we learn about the constellations and planets! We will create math monsters, make our own constellations, and defeat the aliens with our math facts!
- B) **Fancy Nancy** - Get ready to get fancy! This will be a fun and fancy time for everyone who likes to dress up. Campers will enjoy reading stories, learning fancy words, and having fun with games, and activities. We will even make some wonderful wearable items such as jewelry, and other accessories- Ooh la la!

Week 3: June 24-28

- A) **Camping** - Come join us for a fun-filled week of outdoor adventure! Campers will help pitch a tent, go hiking, sing campfire songs, tell not-so-scary stories, and learn some survival skills. We will also observe the animals we share the great outdoors with and explore maps and compasses.
- B) **Lego Designer** - Do you love to create and build with LEGO bricks? Design and build cars and trucks, spacecraft, and perfectly balanced tops. You've got 50 lbs. of bricks to work with. Imagination and creativity is required!

Week 4: July 1-3

- A and B) **Water Works** - Water, water, everywhere! Come find out what a SPLOOSH is. Do water experiments; help build a waterworks with recycled materials, buckets, hoses and more. Be prepared to get wet! A change of clothes is a must!

Week 5: July 8-12

- A) **Animal Adventures** - Campers will have fun exploring interesting facts about their favorite wild animals through unique and creative play. Art, music, movement, and tons of activities will allow their imaginations to ROAR! The campers will enjoy a special visit from Jungle Terry!
- B) **American Girl** - Join us for our very popular fun-filled American Girl Week. Bring your American Girl doll to camp to enjoy DAILY tea parties with real tea sets, doll-sized treats, and girl-sized treats. We will make a variety of crafts for your doll and for yourself!

Week 6: July 15-19

- A) **Lego Building Site** - Design and build an amazing city made out of LEGOS! Help us create a city out of 50 lbs. of bricks on our 4ft. by 8ft. building site! Cars and trucks, skyscrapers and apartment buildings. Let your imagination and creativity be your guide.
- B) **Me & My Doll** - This class is sure to be exciting as we design clothes and accessories for our dolls! Campers are invited to bring along their favorite dolls. Each day we will read a new fun book and enjoy crafts and activities. Join us for lots of fun!

Week 7: July 22-26

- A) **Lights, Camera, Action!** - Get ready to use your imagination! Campers will do improvisational skits and movement exercises as they prepare to cultivate their creativity! Come help build the set, create the costumes and take part in our play!
- B) **Outdoor Art** - Do you love to be outside and enjoy art? Campers will use their creativity as they help create a mural for our fence, create wind chimes, make stepping-stones and create markers for our garden and more!

Week 8: July 29-August 2

- A) **Crazy Creations** - Let your imagination soar! Come and plan, design and build unique creations using boxes, tubes and duct tape. What can you build with 400 cups? We will also experiment with the art of cup stacking.
- B) **Project Runway** - Campers get your scissors ready! Show off your creative side as we design paper fashions. Campers will also dress up and walk down the runway! If you like fashion this camp is for you!

Week 1: June 10-14

Two Minutes To Win It! - Can you beat the clock? Can you balance 10 dice on a popsicle stick? Can you use a string and paper clip to pick up sets of keys? Can you bounce all the ping-pong balls into the container? We will play these and many more fast and frenzied games!

Week 2: June 17-21

Get Your Game On! - Let the games begin! Low tech, no tech! Campers will play, examine and write reviews of different board, strategy, card, and group games. We will also plan, design and create games of our very own. Play on!

Week 3: June 24-28

2D Computer Game Design - Calling all beginning programmers and game designers! We'll use the popular computer program, Game Maker, to program 2D computer games that you can play on your computer at home. Limited to 10 awesome programmers.

Week 4: July 1-3

Beginning Stop Motion - Calling all filmmakers! Get hands-on experience using digital camcorders and Apple's i-Movie editing software. Create your own stop-motion animations using LEGOS or clay and use your imagination! Upload your film to You Tube and become famous!

**Week 5: July 8-12**

Comic Books/Art - \$20 materials fee. Come join us for a week filled with art of all kinds! Ever wish you could make your own comic book starring your own super hero or crazy characters? Campers will also create projects with found objects and materials provided by Mother Nature. Join us for creative fun!

Week 6: July 15-19

Animal Ecosystems - Campers will explore animals, the food chain, climate, and our impact on the ecosystem. They will predict, observe and journal their own 3ft. piece of ecosystem. Campers will get a special visit from Lorain County Metro Parks.

Week 7: July 22-26

Team Building - Ready to make new friends, build communication skills, learn problem-solving skills and have fun? Campers will work together to solve an obstacle course and many more challenges. They will then use their new skills to help build a challenge!

Week 8: July 29-August 2

Lego Building and Simple Machine - Attention all LEGO-maniacs! If you love to create and build with LEGO bricks, this is the camp is for you! Campers will be introduced to the basic physical science concepts of gears, pulleys, levers, wheels and axels while working with LEGOS. The campers will then use their reasoning, prediction, and critical thinking skills as they are challenged to build a LEGO project.

Grades 5–6 Weekly Camp Themes

Week 1: June 10-14

StopMotion Animation I - Calling all filmmakers! Get hands-on experience using digital camcorders and Apple's iMovie® editing software. Create your own stop-motion animations using LEGOS or Clay. Use your imagination! Anything is possible! Upload your film to YouTube and become famous!

2D Computer Game Design - Calling all beginning programmers and game designers! We'll use the popular computer program, Game Maker, to program 2D computer games that you can play on your computer at home. Limited to 10 awesome programmers.

Week 3: June 24-28

Comic Books - \$20 materials fee. Ever wish you could make your own comic book starring your very own superhero? Well, then this camp is for you! Week 4: July 1-3

Ancient Egyptian Artifacts - Mummies, Sarcophaguses, Scarab Beetles, Oh My! Come explore the world of Ancient Egypt! Campers will create 2-D and 3-D art projects as they learn amazing facts about Ancient Egypt.

Week 5: July 8-12

Photography - We'll take photos of everything we see. We'll crop and adjust and filter and resize our photos until they're just right. Learn how to take great photos that will amaze your friends!

Week 6: July 15-19

StopMotion Animation II - Learn new techniques and take your skills to the next level using digital camcorders and Apple's iMovie® editing software. Upload your film to YouTube and become even more famous!

Week 7: July 22-26

Rockets - \$20 materials fee. Up, Up, And Away! Join in the fun as we each build and launch several engine powered rockets in our backyard. Parents are invited to the last session to watch our rockets lift-off!

Week 8: July 29-August 2

Party Planning 101 - Sharpen your study skills as we plan a party! Campers will set a goal, take notes, do Internet research, brainstorm ideas, organize activities, prepare for a presentation, and follow through with responsibilities. We will end our week of camp by carrying out our party plans!



General Information

Extended Care

Extended Care is available every morning and afternoon for Kindergarten Prep and School Age Campers only. The **Breakfast Club** is held from 7:00 am to 8:50 am and features a variety of quiet activities such as board games, videos, and arts and crafts. The **Fun Club** is held from 3:10 pm to 6:00 pm and features both active and quiet game electives.

Drop Off and Pickup

Drop off in the morning begins at 8:50 am. Campers who arrive prior to 8:50 am must be dropped off at the Breakfast Club Program. They will be escorted to their appropriate destinations at 9:00 am. Half-day morning pickup is at 12:00 noon. Pickup at the end of the day is at 3:00 pm. Campers who are not picked up by 3:10 pm will be escorted to the Fun Club Program where they can be picked up any time before 6:00 pm. Campers will be charged for the Fun Club after 3:10 pm, and the Breakfast Club if dropped off before 8:45 am.

Approved Pickup List

No camper will be permitted to leave Pembroke Kids with anyone other than his or her parent unless camp administrators have been otherwise informed in writing in advance.

What to Wear

Campers should wear weather-appropriate, casual summer clothing such as sneakers, shorts, and a tee-shirt - no sandals, flip flops or Crocs - we'll be running outside! A change of clothing is also recommended. Please include sunscreen in your child's lunch box or backpack.

Snacks and Lunch

Parents should provide a snack for half-day campers and must provide a lunch (including beverages) for full-day campers. We recommend the use of an insulated cooler with the camper's name on it. Lots of fresh water is always available. Also please note: We are a peanut-free and tree nut-free facility.

Medical Forms

If you are not currently enrolled in our school, school age campers must fill out ODJFS Child Enrollment Form (JFS 01234) prior to the first day of camp. Preschool and K Prep campers also need ODJFS Medical Form (JFS 01305). These forms can be downloaded from our website, picked up in the school office or mailed. Please contact us if your child has any medical issues.

Prohibited Items

We believe that Summer Camp is a time for making new friends and building relationships; therefore the use of handheld games, electronics, and iPods is prohibited. We are not responsible for any lost personal items.

Termination

Pembroke reserves the right to remove campers from our program for repeated behavioral issues.

Tuition

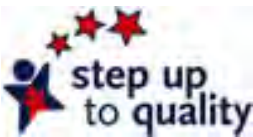
Preschool Camp & Kindergarten Prep: The tuition is \$27 per day. Our Preschool and Kindergarten Prep Camps are half-day programs only. You must sign up for at least 3 days per week. Extended care, mornings only, is available for Kindergarten Prep. See below.

School Age Camp: Tuition is \$35/full day. You must sign up for a minimum of 3 days per week. We reserve the right to cancel a week's camp if there is insufficient enrollment.

Extended Care for Kindergarten Prep and School Age Campers: Mornings in **The Breakfast Club** cost \$6.50 per day, and afternoons (school age only) in **The Fun Club**, cost \$12.50 per day.

Payments and Cancellations: A non-refundable \$75 tuition deposit per child is due when you register. **Tuition balances are due by May 31st.** Credit card payments are accepted and can be taken over the phone. Your deposit is applied to tuition. There is no registration fee, however, some school-age camps have materials fees. Cancellations made prior to May 31st will be refunded in full, less the deposit. All cancellations made after June 10 will be refunded at 50%, less the deposit.
