December is always a fun month at Pembroke Kids. We will celebrate our popular Holiday Traditions where families sign up to visit their child's class to lead a special holiday activity or read a special story. The children enjoy having their families participate and join in the life of their class. Sign-up sheets are posted outside each classroom door.

As an offshoot of our "Music with Mr. Steve" program this year, we will have our first ever holiday concert. We all have been working on a selection of songs we would like to share with you. You will be receiving a flyer with specific and times and dates. This information will also be posted on the bulletin board and the school calendar.

Pembroke Kids is sponsoring a family for Christmas. They are staying at Family Promise Homeless Shelter for a period of time. In this season of giving, we invite you to help us provide gifts for this family, which we will deliver to Family Promise on December 18<sup>th</sup>. #### Miss Sue and Miss Sara

With Halloween and Thanksgiving behind us, our classroom has been a very busy place. We had lots of fun
during our two-week theme of forest animals. We
learned about nocturnal animals like raccoons, bats, and
owls. We also learned a new word "diurnal" which
pertains to animals that are awake during the day. Some
other new words were talon and owlets. The children
enjoyed finding various sticks, leaves, and branches
from the garden to help make our new "alphabet" on the
wall. Please make sure to check it out!

We incorporated math with a dice game. We rolled a die and made tally marks corresponding to the dots on the die to count forest animals. We also made animal footprint puzzles, fed acorns to squirrels, and sorted various parts of the Goldilocks and the Three Bears story ordering from smallest to biggest.

On our writing center table, we had several activities: cutting exercises and tracing straight and diagonal lines from left to right on laminated sheets with dry erase markers. Students worked with clay adding toothpicks and cut straws to make porcupines. All these activities help strengthen little fingers and hands.

Our art table was busy as well. The children created a forest of trees with a variety of green papers. They also made owl masks, rolled pinecones in a box with paint, painted with evergreen branches, and made porcupines out of clay and toothpicks.

We had a few days prior to Thanksgiving to talk about what we are really thankful for. Sara and I were very impressed by the answers the children gave us. The children were thankful for family, hugs, school, etc. We also talked about foods we like to eat at Thanksgiving and the first Thanksgiving. We had a popcorn treat on the last day before Thanksgiving break, which we learned was one of the foods the Indians helped the pilgrims sow and harvest.

The children have been looking at their "All About Me" books lately and love to share them with friends. If you have not returned yours, please do so since the children love exploring them. If you need a new packet of the pages, please let us know.

We also have a "wall" of family pictures on our classroom door. If you have not supplied us with a family photo yet, your child would love to have yours displayed.

When we come back from Thanksgiving break, we will have a two-week theme on gingerbread. Don't forget to sign up to share a tradition and/or read a holiday story to the class at dismissal time. On Friday, December 20th, we will join the kindergarteners and 1st and 2nd graders as we board the Polar Express. Please have your preschooler wear pajamas to school that day. We may have a surprise visitor!

January will be full of icy themes and science experiments using snow and ice! Brrrrr

November seemed to zoom by with the anticipation of Thanksgiving. Our month was filled with classroom activities focused on community workers, health and safety. As we talked about community helpers, the children enjoyed sharing their parents' jobs. Did you know that someone's dad only sleeps and eats at work? We won't mention names. We also discovered that many of your children are aspiring doctors!

Two weeks of health and safety included making and eating healthy snacks, moving to stay fit, and talking about ways to keep our bodies safe. At the art table, the children enjoyed many open-ended activities. They used unique painting tools like celery leaves, scallion roots. and cooked spaghetti. Many of our friends made "pizzas" from dough squeezed out of condiment bottles. These types of art experiences are enjoyable and educational. The process of creating art helps all children express feelings and practice fine motor and hand-eye coordination. Open-ended art also encourages problemsolving and decision-making skills. For example, a child might figure out how to make legs stick to their clay creation or decide what object to choose for their collage. Most importantly, the art activities we do in our classroom ensure that your children experience success.

We have been working on cutting with scissors this month. Please let your children practice at home and remind them to "keep 2 thumbs up." They should always be able to see both thumbs when using scissors. With the holiday season fast approaching, it might be nice to let your little elves help cut wrapping paper for you. Just draw a line and let them cut!
