Carrie's "floater" responsibilities will enable us to begin using a new curriculum assessment system that we will be implementing this fall.

Pembroke Kids preschool currently uses a curriculum entitled Creative Curriculum. Creative Curriculum provides a developmental continuum with measurable milestones with which we chart your child's progress. Our progress reports are generated from this information. The portfolio contains work samples documenting your child's progress. The new Teaching Strategies Gold is the latest version of Creative Curriculum. We are embracing the latest technology with this new system. Each classroom will have an i-Pad mini. With this technology, teachers will be able to have everything in one place - assessments, photos, work samples, artwork. We will be able to document most assessments on the i-Pad using photography and video. Much of your child's work will be online through the "Parents Portal." Newsletters, photographs, lesson plans, communications, individual documentation, and more will all be available online. We are excited and anxious! The opportunities are awesome. In order to be up and running for the beginning of school in August, the staff will spend time this summer learning our new system. We plan to phase in the new system gradually, beginning with lesson planning. Next we will do newsletters and the parent portal, moving on to assessments and progress reports.

We will keep everyone up to date, stay tuned!

In kindergarten, we try to incorporate the children's interest as much as possible in our learning. As a result, we spent the past several weeks learning about the Olympics. Easter Break - April 18th - 21st


Because of a late Easter this year, we have another short break – Friday, April 18th, through Monday, April 21st. School resumes on Tuesday, April 22nd.


