Registration

We are preparing 2015-2016 registration materials, which will be sent home on or before December 19th. Registration for 2015 – 2016 is underway. Registration is on a first-come-first-served basis. Returning Pembroke families have a protected period from December 16, 2014 to January 10, 2015. During this time you will be assured to receive the schedule you wish. After that deadline, families new to Pembroke will be scheduled on a first-come-first-served basis along with returning Pembroke families. If you choose to schedule 3 consecutive days, one of those days must be a Monday or a Friday.

We make every effort to take our students outside every day. However, if the conditions prohibit safe outdoor play, we will stay inside and our students will practice their large motor skills in the Wiggle Room. PLEASE make sure your child is prepared for outdoor play every day they attend school. Even if it is quite frigid when you bring your child to school in the morning, temps often rise within hours and the Director may deem it appropriate for outdoor play.

Besides a warm coat, hat, and gloves, on a cold, snowy day your child will need snow pants and boots! Also, shoes AND SOCKS are a must every day! Boots should not be worn all day in the classroom. They are cumbersome and can cause our students to trip. Please make sure every item of clothing has your child's name on it!
