It's hard to believe April is almost over and May is knocking at our door. During the month of April we have been exploring nursery rhymes. Nursery rhymes encourage speech and vocabulary development as well as a love for literacy. Nursery rhymes also encourage children to engage in socio-dramatic play, which allows them the opportunity to try out new roles. The children loved to act out "Jack Be Nimble" and jump over the candlesticks on the carpet. "Hickory Dickery Dock" was another favorite because they were able to run up the clock like a mouse. We have started exploring "signs of spring" which allows the children to explore many math and science concepts. For example, the children used artificial flowers and a colander to create an arrangement. This called upon their fine motor skills, eye-hand coordination, and spatial skills. Students enjoyed counting, sorting and patterning bugs in our science/ math center. The sensory table allowed them to combine all the learning areas at once to experience a concrete concept of what spring brings. We will continue talking about spring, but we will focus on the areas we observe the children take interest in and expand from there.
